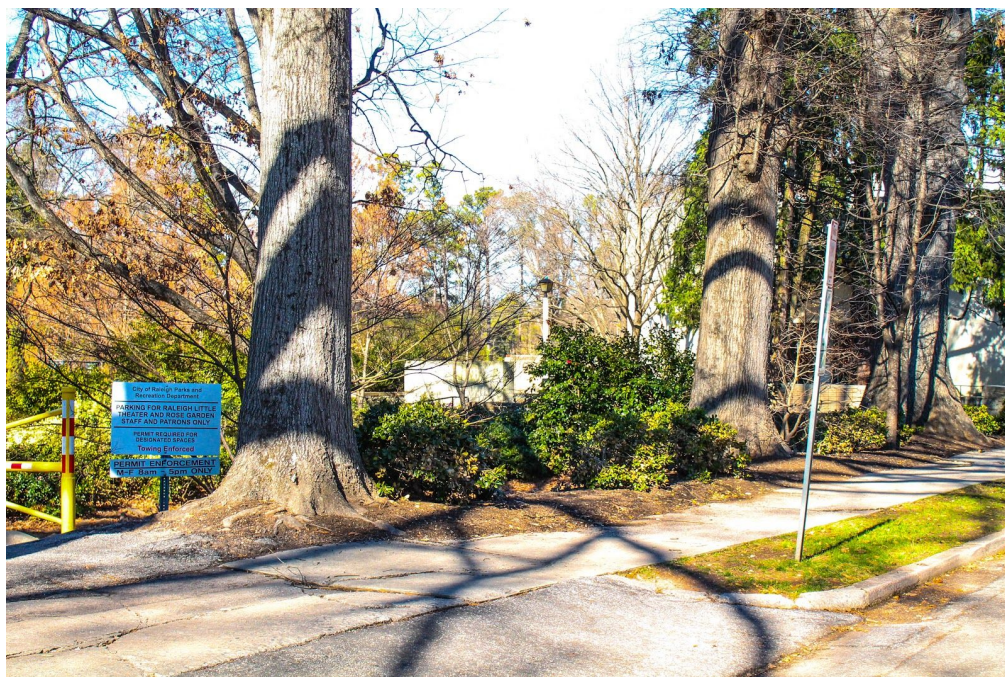


Take a look at what you'll see when you visit
Raleigh Little Theatre!

When I get to Raleigh Little Theatre, we will need to find parking.
We can park in the big parking lot on Pogue Street.



Or we can park on the street in the neighborhood near the theatre.



After we park our car, we'll walk to the theatre.



If we parked in the lot, we will walk down the sidewalk to the Gaddy Theatre entrance. It should take us about three minutes to walk there.



If we parked on the street, we might be closer to the theatre entrance. This is also where we can drop people off closer to the door if we need to.



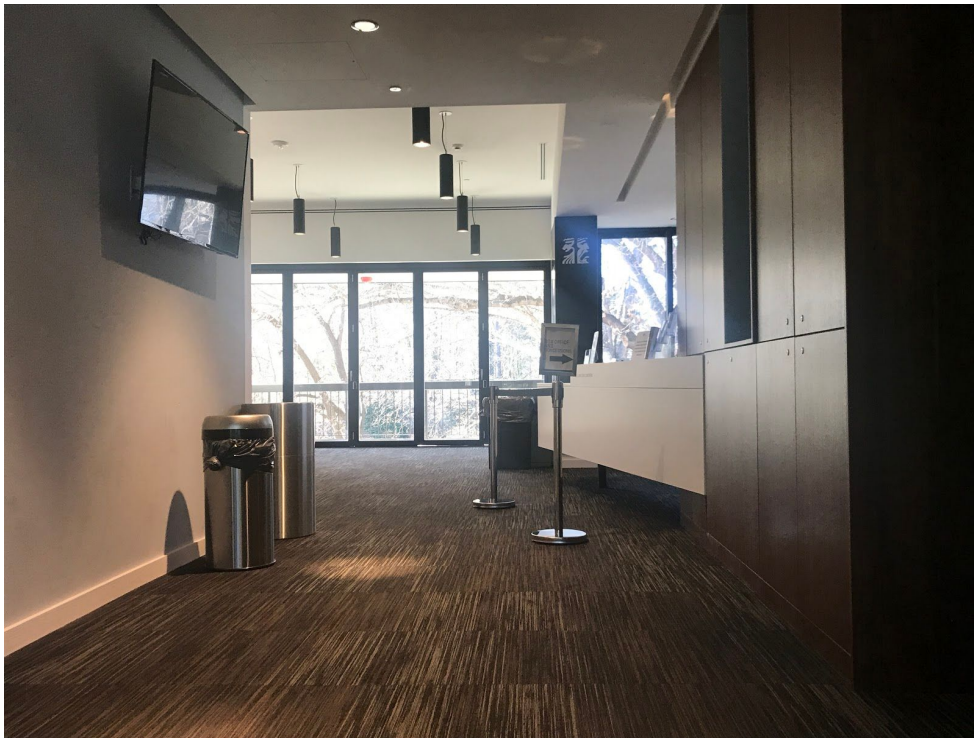
There is a ramp to the left of the porch, or we can use the stairs on the right, leading up to the entrance.



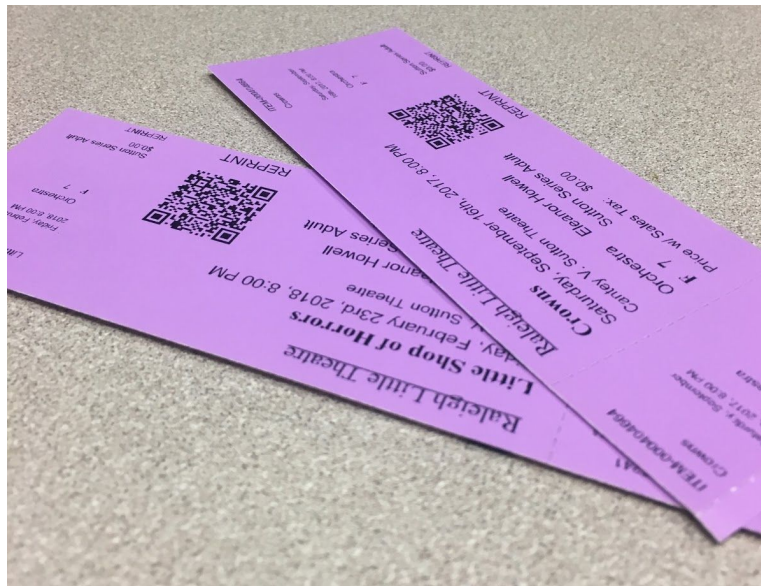
If we don't have our tickets yet,
the person at the box office counter will help us.



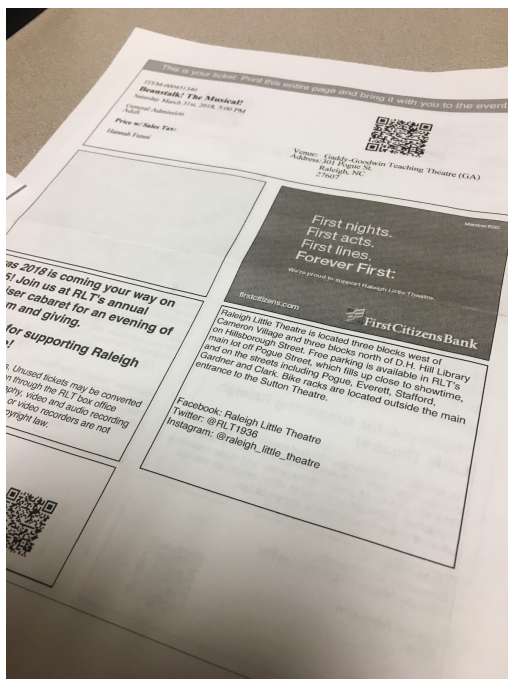
We might have to wait for a little bit if there are other people in line.



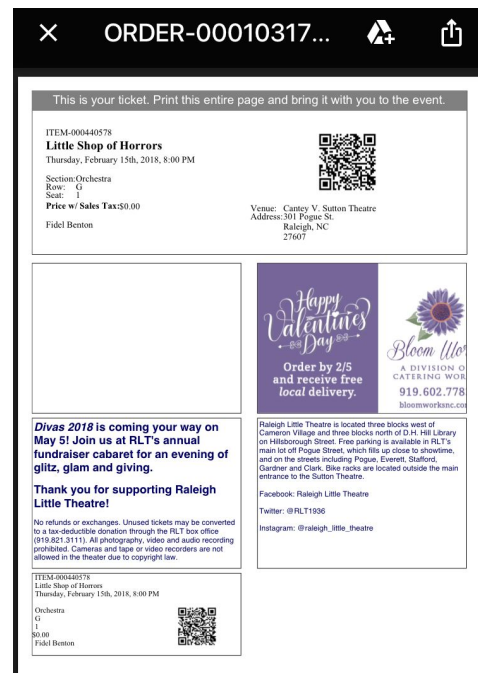
I will need a ticket to enter the theatre.
 My ticket will look like this if the theatre printed it.



Or it will look like this if we printed it at home.



Or like this if we have it on a phone.



When we enter the lobby, I can see that there are wheelchair-accessible bathrooms and places to sit while we wait to go into the theatre.



When we are ready to enter the theatre, an usher will take my ticket to scan it, and then hand it back to me.



After we get our tickets scanned, we can choose to turn right or left to enter the theatre space. We get to choose where we sit.



This theatre has seats on different sides of the space and the stage is the area in the middle.



We will be pretty close to the actors when the show starts!



It's time for the show!

The people on stage are called actors.
They are pretending to be someone else to tell a story.



People might clap during the show. I can clap too,
and I can cover my ears or wear headphones if it gets too loud.



If I need a break, I can tell an adult and we can go back out to the lobby where the quiet space is set up.



When the show is over, I can clap and cheer when the actors come out on stage to take their bows.



I can even meet the actors in the lobby!
They can sign my playbill and even take a picture with me!



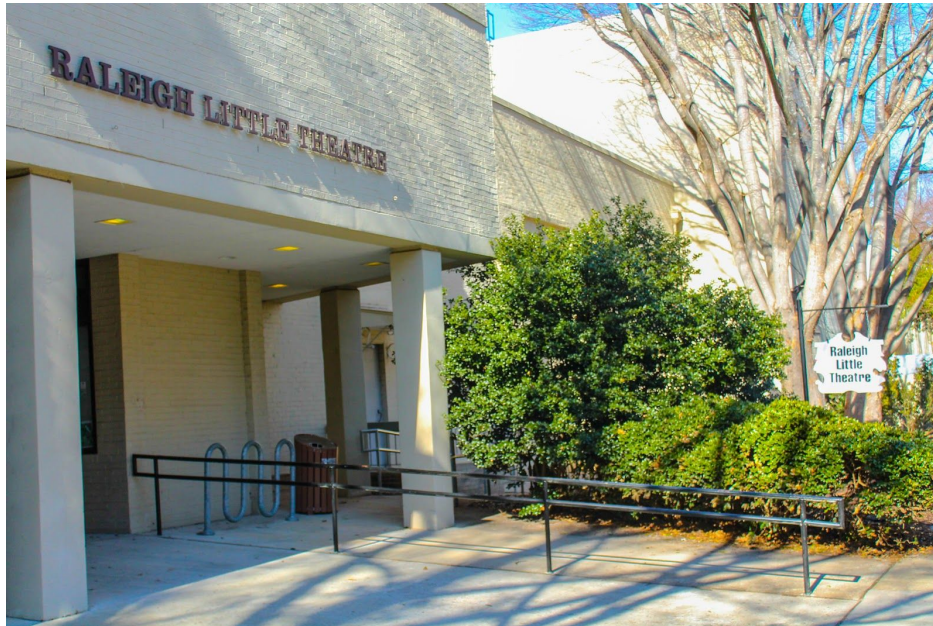
The Raleigh Rose Garden is right next to Raleigh Little Theatre.

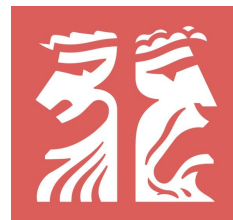
