A Note from the Director

Three years in the making! As the saying goes, third times a charm.

Originally scheduled for RLT's 2020-21 season, the production was rescheduled for the 2021-22 season & made it half-way through rehearsals before being re-scheduled again for the current season...our journey has had its share of ups and downs and yet, as Jane Austen wrote "The distance is nothing when one has a motive."

That this production of *Pride and Prejudice* adapted by Kate Hamill, is not *Pride and Prejudice*, the Jane Austen novel, is another one of those truths that must be universally acknowledged. (to mis-quote Kenneth Tynan...)

Pride and Prejudice is considered a flawlessly written novel, one that is revered by a multitude of readers. During my research for the play, a revelation came when I read that Austen and her family were great lovers of theater. Jane wrote and staged theatricals at home, attended plays in London and Bath, and her letters are full of her reactions to the plays and players she liked (and didn't...). This inspired a fresh take on our theatricals, mixing up Hamill's contemporary spin with our own twist.

Hamill's adaptation of *Pride and Prejudice* is very contemporary. Although it is set in the early 1800s, the play has a sly, modern sensibility. It's fun and feisty and maybe a bit anachronistic—it looks at the Regency era with twenty-first century eyes. The layers of humor, honesty, pathos and theatricality mix well with the underlying questions about society's rules, past and present. What are rules, if not to be broken?

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
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
