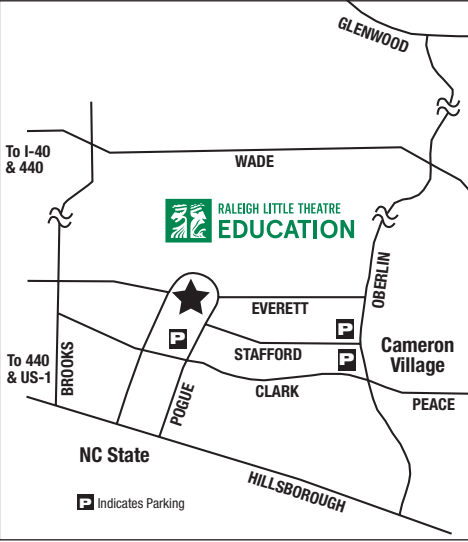

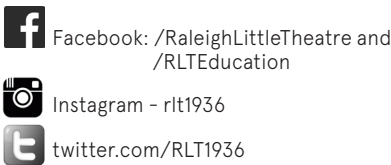

CAMPS AT RALEIGH LITTLE THEATRE

Grades listed reflect student grade in Fall 2018

AGE 4–KINDERGARTEN

Playtime

A half-day camp exploring stories through creative drama, art and movement. Each week students discover stories and characters in a different theme. Through their drama exploration, students also practice listening skills, working together, story sequencing and build social skills. At the end of the week, the class shares a favorite story from the week for family and friends. Tuition: \$175

- Dragons, Wizards and Fairies—Aug 20-24

1st–3rd GRADE

Create-a-Play

Using source material from books and their own imaginations, students create, explore and perform an original play or plays created collaboratively with fellow campers. Full day weeks include daily classes in movement, creative drama, and basic acting skills. Students also create art projects that relating to the week’s theme to support their storytelling. Half day experiences focus on creative drama, playbuilding and basic acting skills. Full day tuition: \$285

1st–6th GRADE

Theatre Arts Camp

Designed as an engaging sampler of drama, visual art, music and dance as students rotate to each arts area daily. Grouped according to age, students learn songs and choreography, play theatre games to build acting skills and work as an ensemble, and create individual art projects throughout the week. Tuition: \$285

4th–6th GRADE

Scriptworks

Students develop essential acting skills including characterization, vocal projection, blocking, working collaboratively and memorizing lines while working on age-relevant scenes from published plays. On the last day of camp, students perform their scenes for family and friends. Tuition: \$285

Musical Theatre Revue: Journey to Broadway

A musical theatre experience in which students develop musical theatre skills learning music, choreography and devising original scenes to tell a story with their songs. Camp culminates in a performance of their work for family and friends. Tuition: \$285

6th–9th GRADE

Kids on Stage: Willy Wonka, Jr.

A two-week, full day camp in which students rehearse a musical. Each participant auditions for and receives a role. All students learn their lines, blocking, choreography and music to perform the musical at the end of the week, supported by minimal production elements. Tuition: \$445

7th–9th GRADE

Stage Skills

Develop a range of acting skills through daily scene study, movement and improv classes. Students also choose one of three theatre elective classes so they can tailor their week to their interests. This year, choose from: stage combat, commedia dell’arte and sketch comedy. Tuition: \$285

Musical Theatre Revue: Broadway Time Warp

A musical theatre experience in which students develop musical theatre skills learning music, choreography and devising original scenes to tell a story with their songs. Tuition: \$285

Original Scriptworks

Students will develop skills in performance, storytelling, improvisation and character development as they collaborate to create, rehearse and share original performance work. Tuition: \$285

10th–12th GRADE

High School Intensives

A one week, in-depth experience for teens focused on a specific areas of theatre. Topics are paired together in a week, but operate as separate intensive experiences. Intensives meet 9a-4:30p. Tuition: \$285

TEENS ON STAGE (TOS)

In this seven-week intensive program, students attend classes and rehearse for the production. Classes in advanced acting, voice and movement support each student’s artistic growth and character development from rehearsal to performance.

TEENS BACKSTAGE (TBS)

This technical training program is a unique opportunity for teens to develop skills in lighting, sound, set construction, scenic painting and costuming. The first half of the program includes master classes and hands-on learning in all production areas. In the second half of the program, each TBS student choose a focus area and are assigned a run crew position for the run of the performance based on their skills and interests.
