Letter from the Director

When I began volunteering at RLT back in the early 80's, I never thought about directing. Whether I was in the ensemble, chorus or had a leading role, I was happy to be performing. That was it, that was all.

But things shifted. I would audition repeatedly; I was not cast. This cycle went on for a while. That did not deter me from being involved at RLT. I still wanted to be involved at RLT, so I started volunteering backstage. I have worked on just about all the crews: concessions, ushering, house management, deck, props, dressing, assistant stage manager, stage management, etc.

To my surprise, my name was placed on that list. I am forever grateful to Heather Strickland, former RLT Executive Director, and Patrick Torres, former Artistic Director, for selecting me to direct this wonderful play. I am honored and humbled. Heather and Patrick, I am forever grateful to you for selecting me and giving me this chance to direct again at RLT.

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
